


Blue Angels Dance Team

Syringa Rebekahs of Jerome Began in 1914



JEROME - Sixty-two years ago, on January 27, 1914, Syringa Lodge No. 110, Independent Order of Odd Fellows, was begun in Jerome by Sister Anna M. Hite, president of the Rebekah Assembly of Idaho, assisted by Sister Ireva Spedell, Past Noble Grand of Evening Star Rebekah Lodge No. 25, of Rupert. Brother Roy Shillington served as Secretary.

The ten petitioners for the charter were: Sisters Amy Heiss, Carol Hall, Gail Krevanik, Josephine Sargent, Mary Massey. Anna Burkhalter and Kate Forbes, Brothers Walter Heiss, George Bissell and T.E. Sarent.

Following the institution, an initiation was held for forty-six candidates. The degree of Rebekah was conferred by the staff of Margurite Rebekah Lodge No. 98 of Gooding.

After the meeting, a banquet was served at the old North Side Inn, which was prepared and served by the chef, Tennel.

In 1936, the Odd Fellows purchased the old Victory Theatre, which was on of Jerome's oldest landmarks, having been built in 1910. It was on the corner Avenue A and Adams.

This was the lodge hall until on April 10, 1943, the entire structure was destroyed by fire, at a loss of \$200,000.

The members of the two lodges began to rally following the total loss and by 1949 were housed in their brand new hall just East of South Lincoln on Ave. B. This is where the Rebekahs meet today.

There are six brothers and ninety-two sisters belonging to Syringa Rebekah Lodge No. 110 today. We have taken in seven new members the past year, five by initiation, one by reinstatement and one by transfer.

Officers for 1976 are: Noble Grand, Annie May Hart; Vice-Grand, Pearl Utter; Recording Secretary, Katherine Rolfe; Financial Secretary, Shirley Shropshire; and Treasurer, Elsie Andrews.

SGL Community Ideas Part 1

Fraternal greetings from your Odd Fellow and Rebekah Membership Chairmen! The next few months we will be sharing with you a list of 100 Community Ideas generated by Sovereign Grand Lodge. This list was created to help lodges find ways to better participate in their communities. We are confident that using these ideas can help raise awareness for your lodge and thus build your membership.

1. Participate in Adopt a Highway. For those not familiar with this, your organization agrees to pick up trash along a section of the highway at least quarterly and you get your name on a highway sign that says "Adopt-A-Highway" and the organization's name.

2. Sponsor a booth at your county fair/fall and spring festival of your hometown and provide free water and have handouts about your local lodge.

3. Put together snack packs/ travel size toiletry items to be given to families of patients in ICU at the hospital all the while working as a volunteer at the hospital. Remember to include information about your local lodge with the items.

4. Volunteer at your local library to provide tutoring to at risk students in the local schools. We have a program here called CAPS (Children Are People) that provides this type of help. Our local Lodges provide school supplies on an ongoing basis.

5. Open your lodge hall for use of community functions.

- 6. Sponsor a "Make a Difference Dinner" and invite those within your community who have "made a difference".
- 7. Have an Open House at the lodge hall and invite the community to come and learn about the Order.
- 8. Sponsor a local Scout Troop/Youth Sports Team.

9. Provide an activity packet to include coloring books, crayons, puzzle books etc. to be given to children in the local hospital. Remember to include information about your local lodge.

10. If your community has a Volunteer Fire Department sponsor a fundraising event to help raise funds for equipment.

11. Participate in several parades, city and/or community, every year. If there are no parades, organize one to celebrate various holidays (St. Patrick's Day, Christmas, etc.).

12. Become a docent for your historical society and specialize in fraternal organizations.

- 13. Partner with Habitat for Humanity.
- 14. Partner with Keep America Beautiful and serve on a regular basis.
- 15. Sponsor a community Thanksgiving, Easter, New Year's Eve, etc. event every year.
