Just a Rambling note from the Grand Secretary

There have been questions and some confusion on the dues break down mostly the historical building funds that is collected for the historical building. Odd Fellows pay \$1.50 per member this came to \$195.00 collected for this year. Rebekah's just raised historical building this year to \$1.50. It takes \$11,241. To operate the historical building for a year this includes, city water/sewer/trash, power, gas, insurance and irrigation. It would cost more on the utilities if we had a caretaker living in the building.

Sovereign Grand Lodge dues are \$18.50 per year. For this year we paid Sovereign Grand Lodge \$4107.00 for Odd Fellow Dues, Odd Fellow Members only pay \$12.50 per year. This year's dues collected was \$2737.00 Grand Lodge picks up the other \$6.00 per member. The Rebekahs also pay a portion for their members. With Sovereign Grand Lodge getting ready to raise their dues up to \$24.50 this coming 2016 session.

Grand lodge and the Rebekah Assembly has also has picked up a \$5000.00 shortfall in Newspapers budget. Odd Fellows member pay \$6.00 and Rebekahs have been paying \$5.50 per member for the 12 issues per year. The Newspaper board had a meeting the first of April if they lost both Odd Fellows and Rebekah Assembly help with their shortfall they would have to raise the newspaper to \$12.00 a year per member. Both of Executive Committees Odd Fellow and Rebekah meet with the Newspaper Board last month. The newspaper will be working on cutting costs. The newspaper has stopped mailing out the extra papers. The printer has a 1000 minimum with only 600 being mailed out to our dues paying members. So this year at sessions will both bring again a resolution to help the newspaper out of there shortfall.

Without Grand Lodge and the Rebekah Assembly helping out our members' dues would be have to be \$38.00 per member for this coming year. \$24.50 going to Sovereign Grand Lodge \$12.00 to the Newspaper and \$1.50 to the Historical Building. Some of the other jurisdictions dues are \$45.00 and higher. Idaho has one of the lowest dues in the order.
