The International Day of Charity was designated by the United Nations General Assembly in an effort to mobilize the world to help others. The day is celebrated every year on September 5th, the anniversary of the death of Mother Theresa of Calcutta, one of the most philanthropic individuals of our time. Mother Theresa passed away in 1997 at the age of 87 after a lifetime of charitable work with the sick and dying in India.

US Flags should be flown at half mast - both on US soil and abroad.

A moment of silence is held at 8:46 a.m. (EST) across the nation - commemorating the time the first plane struck the North Tower of the World Trade Center on September 11, 2001.

Patriot Day is a day the US remembers the terrorist attacks on September 11, 2001. This day is commonly referred to as 9-11 (Nine-Eleven). It is believed that 2,977 people died in the attacks. President George W. Bush proclaimed September 11th Patriot Day in 2002.

Cambridge Lodge History Begins in 1888 in Town of Salubria

Cambridge - By September 24, 1888, the first Odd Fellow lodge was instituted by D.L. Badly, Grand Master and was known as Salubria Lodge No. 27, IOOF. Meetings were held in a room on the upper floor of the IOOF Hall located near the crossroad of the old town of Salubria, then in Ada County.

But this building has long since disappeared along with the rest of the town.

On May 8, 1891, a Rebekah lodge was instituted by Wm. Allison, Deputy Grand Master of Salubria Lodge No. 27, IOOF. The name Welcome was chose by a charter member from the Bible, denoting the welcome given by Rebekah to Abraham and Isaac.



This lodge, the 17th Rebekah lodge to be instituted in Idaho, never has through the years has its name or number changed, so is still Welcome Rebekah Lodge No. 17.

In 1900 the lodge decided to give up its charter, but before enough time elapsed to make this final, the lodge was resuscitated, with the charter restored March 29, 1901.

With the railroad into the valley, Cambridge sprang up and on August 22, 1902, another Odd Fellows lodge was instituted by H.W. Sutton, Past Grand. This lodge was known as Cambridge Lodge No. 91, IOOF.

By 1904, the new town was growing and the old one dying and Cambridge Lodge No. 91 and Salubria Lodge No. 27 consolidated under the name of Cambridge Lodge No. 27, IOOF of Cambridge, which is still the lodge name and number. On June 20, 1904, this new lodge located in Cambridge and Welcome Rebekah Lodge moved to Cambridge also.

A 1906 fire destroyed charters of both lodges plus records.

In 1908 the Odd Fellows built a cement block hall known now as the Williamson Building or Kay's Drive-Inn.

In 1921, Moses Hopper built a brick building with the upper story constructed especially as a lodge hall. This building in later years was known as the McCaddn Blacksmith Shop.

The cement building was condemned because of a crack in the wall; need for funds caused the sale of the cement building; the lodges moved into the Hopper Building where they met until 1923. They moved back into the cement building, continuing to meet until the new hall was purchased in 1950.

In March 1943, the first of a number of War Bonds were purchased to start a building fund.

In 1947, a Theta Rho Club was instituted with 28 girls and 20 Rebekah sisters. The club was active for several years until several girls withdrew to start a new club at Indian Valley, 13 miles away and the remaining girls lost interest and disbanded in 1964.

In 1948, the Odd Fellow Lodge bought some available lots. In 1949 a CARE package, sent overseas by Rebekahs, happened to be received by an Odd Fellow family in Austria and for a number of years packages were sent to them regularly. However, the letters gradually ceased.

In 1950, a cinder block building became available and the Odd Fellows with Rebekah approval, purchased this building in March 1950. My March 1953, over 200 attended the mortgage burning ceremony.

In the fall of 1957, the lodges entered the Youth Program of the United Nations by joining the lodges of District No. 12 to send one student each year on the pilgrimage, and several boys and girls from the school have been chosen for the tour.

The group also supports youth organizations, such as 4-H, Boys' and Girls' State, the Dennis Anderson Memorial Fund for Scholarships and the Community Christmas Fund as well as the projects of the order.


