





Riggins Garnet Rebekah Lodge 120 Began in 1948



Riggins-On July 10, 1948, State Assembly President, Lillian Hughes, with her Grand Officers and members of surrounding Rebekah Lodges gave birth to a new lodge in the state of Idaho, and town of Riggins. It was names Garnet, for the garnet stones found along the bars of the Salmon River and numbered 120. Seven sisters and one brother were listed as charter members and that evening, twelve more were initiated. Hazel Spickelmire was elected as the first Noble Grand.

Like any healthy baby, Garnet grew rapidly and by March 15, 1949, she had thirty-eight members, of whom

three were brothers and five Past Noble Grands and she had her own drill team.

It was about this time that Sister Della Flynn, a charter member, made the scarves for each of the stations depicting the four emblems, the Bee Hive, the Mood and Seven Stars, the Lily, and the Dove. Through the years, Sister Della had contributed much to Garnet's growth. She made the beautiful Rebekah flag with all the emblems embroidered by hand, which is always displayed at all our meetings. One of her greatest contributions to our lodge is the importance of memorizing the charges. At age 92 years plus, she can still give all her charges.

Through the years, eight Decoration of Chivalry jewels have been given and we are now trying to give one each year to a worthy member. Sister Olive Looney is our only sister to receive the Veteran Jewel of 50 years, but other sisters receive their 15 year jewels as they become due.

Garnet has done many note-worthy things both inside and outside the order. She assists the Odd Fellows financially with all their needs and contributions to all worthy fund raising affairs in the community. Garnet helps toward the support of the Home on the Hill and always supports the State Assembly President's projects.

Through the years, many of Garnet's members have been asked to work on the floor at the State Assemblies.

Now, for this Bicentennial Year of 1976, Garnet has become almost a mature woman at age 28 years. She can boast of eighty-one sisters and seven brothers as paid up members and twenty-seven Past Noble Grands.

Petitioners were Pearl H. McClurg, Henrietta Wright, Frances Crosson, Mary Ruckholg, Emma O'Leary, Ella Buchholtz, Marie Johnson, Loretta V. Emmerson, Mabel Hugg, Frances Leonard, Rose Mill, Sophia Burkholtz, Mable Tiger, Sadie Johnson, Anna M. Creasy, Ella Hutchings and Laura Thurston. The Department Commander was A.F. Joham and the Adj. was C.D. Rush.

Lady Irene Hamilton received an appointment of Assistant to the Sentry in 1946, to the International Association; this started her climb for the highest office as President in 1950.

We have been honored to have several of our ladies as Association President, currently our Lady Frances NcNeal Yardley is the Vice President, she will bring us more honors by filling the president's chair. Our Ladies, Irene Hamilton, Ruby Drake and Jean Markham, have been waving our colors at International Association meetings and we feel sure more will join the ranks of the distinguished Ladies in the service of our branch of the Order.

Currently the Auxiliary count is 57 members, in the Ladies Auxiliary: 26 in Canton Columbia #3. We have 51 Past Presidents on PP list since the beginning in 1927. We work very diligently trying to perform the duties for which this auxiliary was formed.


