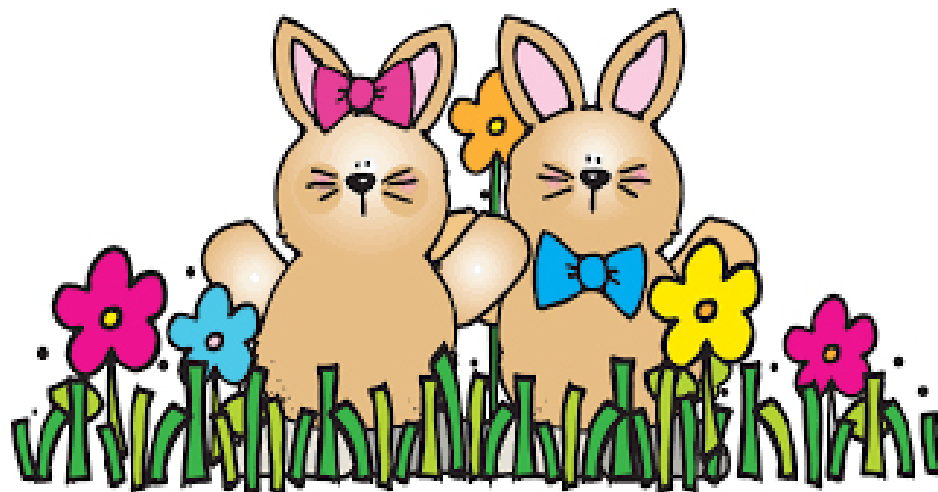

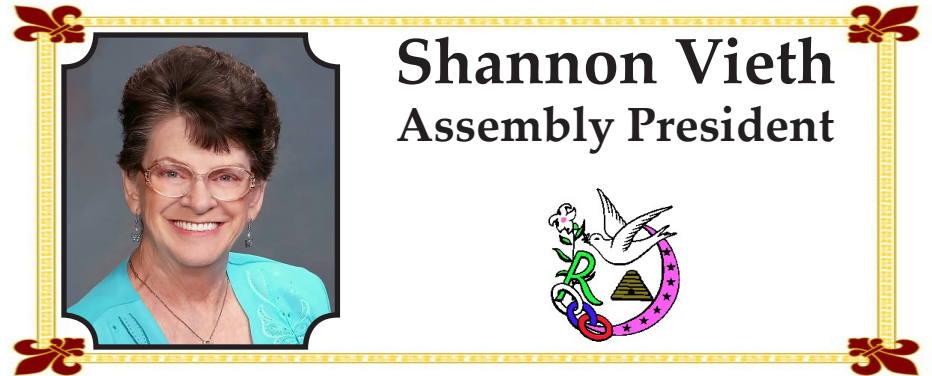

## Founders Day ~ April 26



**Thomas Wildey**

Thomas Wildey, founder of Odd Fellowship in North America, was a man of immense vitality, humor, and warmth.

Thomas Wildey was born in London, England, January 15, 1783. He was left an orphan five years later - and the Odd Fellow pledge to "Educate the Orphan" sprang from his personal childhood experiences. At the age of 14, Wildey went to live with an uncle. After he had 9 years of schooling, he became an apprentice to a maker of coach springs. He joined the Odd Fellows in 1804.

When restlessness brought Thomas Wildey to America in 1817, the British were still unpopular in the States because of the War of 1812. In that year Baltimore was suffering both a yellow fever epidemic and mass unemployment. An outgoing personality, Wildey missed companionship and advertised in the newspaper to determine if there were any other Odd Fellows in Baltimore; he requested them to meet him at the Seven Stars Inn.

On April 26, 1819, Wildey and the four men who responded to the advertisement formed the Independent Order of Odd Fellows in North America, dedicating the Order to achieve philanthropic goals. Other Englishmen who were Odd Fellows had grouped in the states along the Eastern Seaboard, and Wildey gathered them all into the newly formed fraternity. He traveled widely to set up lodges in the most recently settled parts of the country.

At the time of his death in 1861, there were more than 200,000 members of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows in 42 states.

### Odd Fellowship in Idaho



In the year that Idaho became a territory, Odd Fellowship had its beginning under the jurisdiction of the Grand Lodge of Oregon.

By 1873 the Oregon Grand Lodge had chartered six lodges in Idaho, and they were all successful and prospering. In 1877 the six lodges had increased in membership to 214. Scarcity of money and dull times were factors in lodge membership, and many brothers planned to join the Order when the mining season was over. Each lodge was so isolated that the distance was too great to receive much advantage from the Grand Lodge of Oregon. A Grand Lodge was badly needed in the Territory of Idaho.

In 1879 a petition for a charter for a Grand Lodge in this Territory had been submitted, when unanimous approval was secured, the Grand Sire was authorized to issue a Warrant for a Grand Lodge in this Jurisdiction. Duplicate charters, dated April 25, 1879, were issued by the Sovereign Grand Lodge to take the place of charters granted by the Grand Lodge of Oregon to the six established lodges in the Territory of Idaho.

Through the years, however, Odd Fellowship has labored hard and long to improve its organization. Many times the constitutions of the Grand Lodge and the Subordinate Lodges needed to be revised or amended. With the changing conditions, new legislation was needed. Effective in Sovereign Grand Lodge on the first of January, 1925, was the change in the age status for membership. Eighteen-year-olds were allowed to join the Order, and Idaho immediately fell in line with this new policy. In October, 1945, the Grand Jurisdictional Lodge was legalized. This new law enabled members of defunct lodges to pay their dues directly into this Jurisdictional Lodge, thus protecting their membership in the Order. Three brothers soon became members of this Jurisdictional Lodge in Idaho. In 1952 a Commission for the Advancement of Odd Fellowship was a unique organization that was increasingly successful in its efforts to ferret out the weak spots in the Order and apply effective corrective measures. In other fields of endeavor the Subordinate Lodge has legislated and strived to attain the best for its organization.

One of the proudest and happiest years of Idaho's members was the year of 1928-the year when Frank Martin became the Grand Sire of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows of the world.

Then, again, in 1955 the Brothers of all Branches of the Order were just as proud and happy when Margaret Watts became President of the International Association of Rebekah Assemblies.

It is this Branch of the Order that has paved the way for all other Branches. There could have been no other Branch had it not been for the Subordinate Lodge, which later organized the Grand Lodge and the Sovereign Grand Lodge. From such beginnings came the Encampment, Patriarchs Militant, Rebekahs, and the Ladies Branches of the Encampment and Patriarchs Militant, as well as the Youth organizations.

## Lewiston IOOF Lodge Begins Before Grand IQdge of Idaho



LEWISTON-The institution and organization Lewiston Lodge No. 8 at Lewiston, Idaho April 26, 1881 sponsored by a small group of local men, began before the Grand Lodge of Idaho was instituted in state of Idaho. The Grand Lodge of Oregon organized the first nine lodges of Idaho. Lewiston No. 8 was eighth. Colfax Lodge No. 14, Washington came Lewiston to institute lodge April 26, 1881 traveling from Colfax in a hack, the popular mode of traveling at that time.

After the lodge was instituted the following named officers were elected; Brothers Norman Buck, Noble Grand, W.B. Cooper, Vice Grand, S.G. Isaman, recording secretary, and L. Rowley, Treasurer.

Tuesday night was selected as the regular meeting night (and to my knowledge of the last 53 years has met on Tuesday night.

The first meeting was held in the Masonic Hall. The meetings were held at various places until the present building at 609 Main Street was built. Plans and specifications for the new lodge hall, a brick 36 by 80' was read, accepted and a contract let for the sum of \$3,782.56. This structure was begun in 1890 and completed in 1893. And meetings have been continuous ever since.

It is interesting to note how the SCENE now the property of the lodge was secured. Some of the brothers felt they should have a real SCENE, as the lodge to this time had been without one. They robbed a grave, cleaned the flesh from the bones and dried them, then fastened the bone joints in the proper manner, so this SCENE is really from a human being. It is said that the corpse was a man by the name of Peebles who was an outlaw.

The Grand Lodge of Idaho was instituted November 13, 1883 and by that institution this lodge was cut from Washington and placed under the jurisdiction of Idaho.

It was first noted on March 18, 1884 a member was expelled from the lodge membership for appropriating money of the lodge for his own use.

June 5, 1885 a committee of Rebekah Degree petition for establishing a Rebekah Degree was read and sent to the secretary of the Grand Lodge. A meeting was called June 16, 1885 for the purpose of organizing the Rebekah Degree.

The lodge paid a bill to the cemetery committee \$116.67 for lots in the cemetery for lodge members use. March 27, 1888, one hundred cemetery deeds were printed.

It was certified October 27, 1892 by a Notary Public, Lewiston Lodge No. 8, I.O.O.F. was incorporated, that the purpose it was formed was for benevolence and charity, in the city of Lewiston, Idaho, that the term is to exist fifty years after the date of incorporation and that the number of trustees shall be three.

Gateway Lodge No. 111 was instituted April 18, 1905. Lewiston Lodge No. 8 conferred the degree on a class of forty-seven. Lewiston Lodge No. 8 donated its old robes to Gateway No. 111. Gateway consolidated with Lewiston No. 8 January 1, 1915 with eighty members.

March 15, 1932 the Washington Water Power Company leased the lower floor of the Odd Fellows building and is in the same location in 1976 although at the present time is building at a new location on Main Street.

Because of gas rationing, January 1943, the lodge decided to meet only two nights a month, the second and fourth Tuesdays and are continuing the same nights at the present time. At the same time terms of office were changed from six months to a year.

C.P. Hinkle (Charles Porter) was recording secretary of Lewiston Lodge No. 8 from January 1, 1908 to December 31, 1945 and it is to him we owe credit for keeping history of his lodge up to the time of his death in 1946.

Three members of Lewiston Lodge No. 8 attained Grand Lodge offices: Calvin A. Martin, Grand Patriarch 1947-1948; Horace A. Bradshaw, Grand Master, 1955-1956; Glenn W. Jordan, Grand Patriarch, 1963-1964; Harmon Snyder now serving as Grand Treasurer-Patriarchs.

The Odd Fellows Hall was badly smoke damaged by the fire that destroyed the Hotel Idaho January 9, 1976.

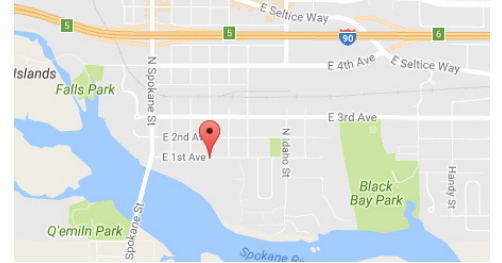
