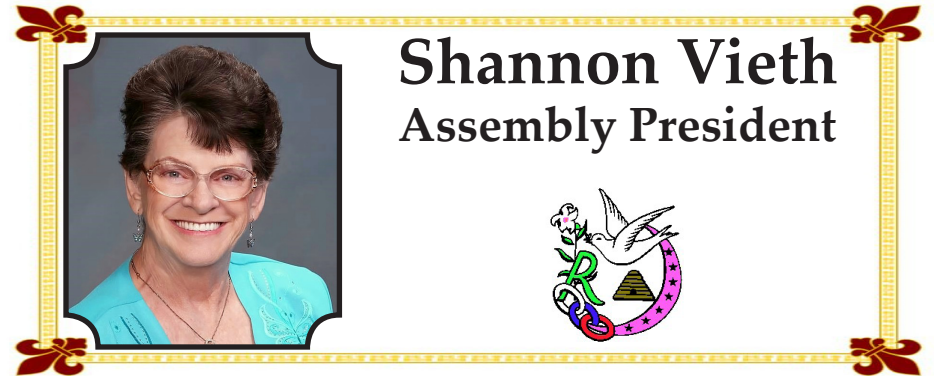

Grangeville's Mt. Idaho Lodge No. 7 Instituted in 1880



Grangeville - Mt. Idaho Lodge #7 was instituted at Mt. Idaho May 8, 1880 by Special Deputy Sovereign Grand Sire from Dayton, Washington.

Our Charter from the Grand Lodge of the United States was signed by John Harmon, Grand Sire, attested to by James Ridgley-keeper of the seals and rituals. He wrote the Past Grands Degree.

We met in the upstairs of Brown's Grist Mill, Mt. Idaho until 1885, then moved to Grangeville in a two story building on the corner of South Hall and South Street.

We moved to present building at the end of North C Street in 1967.

The lodge had 5 Past Grand Masters: J.W. Forney, 1885-1886; Levi Magee, 1902-1903; Jas. F. Ailshie, 1913-1914; M. Reese Hattabaugh, 1-26-1927 and Hampton Taylor, 1933-1934.

Camas Prairie Encampment No. 18 was instituted October 18, 1898.

Two Past Grand Patriarchs exist: W.H. Williams, 1906-1907 and Earl Huff, 1952-1953 - who both served the city of Grangeville as Police Chiefs. Patriarch Williams was killed in the performance of his duties. Patriarch Huff is presently chairman on the Idaho Odd Fellow Editorial Board.

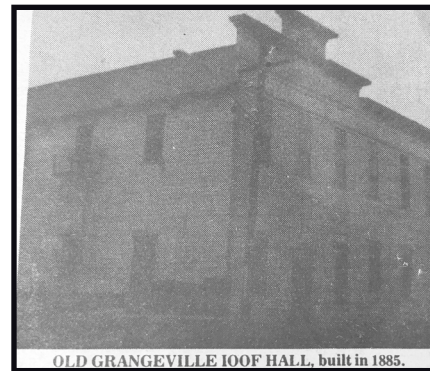


Friendship Day The First Sunday of August

In 1935, the United States Congress, proclaimed the first Sunday of August as National Friendship Day. Following the popularity and success of Friendship Day in US, several other countries adopted the tradition of dedicating a day to friends. Friendship Day is celebrated by several countries around the world.

In 1997, the United Nations named Winnie the Pooh as the world's Ambassador of Friendship.

Rebekahs Began in 1889 In Grangeville IOOF Hall



Grangeville - According to dispensation granted on August 31, 1889, a Lodge of the Daughters of Rebekah was instituted in the lodge room of Mt. Idaho Lodge #7, IOOF, by Grand Representative J.H. Forney assisted by Brothers Odle, Nickel and Ready.

The Charter was issued on October 18, 1889 to charter members Mary E. Forney, Mrs. S.M. Hall, Belle Pearson, Alice Crooks, Mrs. C.D. Odle, James Odle, A.F. Parker, J.H. Forney, L.W. Nickle and P.H. Ready.

The name of the lodge was to be Mizpah, with initiation fee of five dollars for gentlemen and ladies free. Dues were set at twenty-five cents per month. The meeting dates have been changed until now lodge meets on the second and fourth Mondays. The initiation fees are now ten dollars and yearly dues are five dollars.

The I.O.O.F. Hall was built in 1885. It served as a community hall, opera house, theater and a variety of other purposes. An addition was built on in 1908. This lodge hall was in use until 1967 when it was torn down. The members purchased the former site of a cabinet shop and remodeled it for their new hall. Like the first building, it serves the community in various ways. We plan to burn the mortgage this year (1976) at our Christmas party.

In reading through the old minute books, we found the lodge had problems all through the years, same as we do today.

Our lodge has been honored by having some of our members serve as President of the Assembly of Idaho. Those serving were: Mrs. Reese Hattabaugh and Mrs. Eleanor Huff. Mrs. Hattie Fry of the Ferdinand Lodge also serves as Assembly President of the Rebekahs. She later became a member of Mizpah when their lodge consolidated with the Grangeville Lodge.

Senior Citizens Day is observed on August 21st each year. The day recognizes the contributions older people have made to our society.

Idaho Rebekah Lodge No. 96 Began in Wendell in 1910

Wendell - Rebekah Lodge No. 96 was organized May 5, 1910 by Mrs. Anna Hite who was deputized to institute a Rebekah Lodge.

She was assisted by Mrs. Bertha Bowlby and members of the degree staff of Buhl No. 29. This meeting was held in the IOOF Hall with charter members Bertha Benjamin, Effie Collins, Delia Kappel, Lillian Pennington and Wm. Pennington.

Nellie Dyar became a member by transfer. A total of 28 candidates were initiated right away. The charter was presented November 8.

In 1922 the Lodge had their own staff to put on the degree for the first time.

However, from 1923 to 1935, when records were lost, the lodge was reported inactive.

In 1938, the lodge had 29 members and again in 1942 experienced trouble in gaining a quorum. From 1943-47, members met at homes in the afternoons. In April 1948, the Lodge started to meet in the basement of the Methodist Church.

In 1953, Rebekah Lodge No. 96 and IOOF 131 of Wendell, took steps towards building their own lodge.

In 1955, a Lodge Bible was given to the Lodge at Assembly for a 51 percent gain in membership.

In 1957 the Lodge Kitchen was completed.

A mortgage burning ceremony was held along with the IOOF November 14, 1959. A potluck dinner saw 88 attend.

In 1971, the Lodge received the prize for District No. 6, given by the assembly president to the lodge that traveled the most miles in visiting other Lodges that year.

A Theta Rho Girls Club was sponsored by the Wendell Rebekahs and was instituted on November 23, 1970, with 15 charter members.

Now the Lodge's membership is 68 with resident membership at 47.

Boise - Columbia #3 Ladies Patriarch Militant was instituted April 25, 1927.

Affiliated with Canton Columbia #3, First Battalion, 2nd Regiment, First Brigade, Department of Idaho for and in consideration of such authority promises this Auxiliary to be governed by the Constitution and By Laws of the Department of Idaho.

Subjects of the General Military Council of the Patriarchs Militant and the Sovereign Grand Lodge of I.O.O.F.

Petitioners were Pearl H. McClurg, Henereitta Wright, Frances Crosson, Mary Ruckholz, Emma O'Leary, Ella Ruchholtz, Marie Johnson, Loretta V. Emmeson, Mable Hugg, Frances Leonard, Rose Mill, Sophia Burkholz, Mabel Tiger, Sadie Johnson, Anna M. Creasy, Ella Hutchings and Laura Thurston. The Department Commander was A.F. Joham and the Adj. C.D. Rush.

Lady Irene Hamilton received an appointment of Assistant to the Sentry in 1946, to the International Association, this started her climb for the highest office as President in 1950.

We have been honored to have several of our ladies as Association President, currently our Lady Frances McNeal Yardley is the Vice President. She will bring us more honors by filling the president's chair. Our Ladies, Irene Hamilton, Ruby Drake and Jean Markham, have been waving our colors at International Association meetings and we feel sure more will join the ranks of the distinguished ladies in the service of our branch of the Order.

Currently the Auxiliary count is 57 members in the Ladies Auxiliary; 26 in Canton Columbia #3. We have 51 Past Presidents on our PP list since the beginning in 1927. We work very diligently trying to perform the duties for which this auxiliary was formed.

August 4th U.S. Coast Guard Day

On August 4, 1790, the Revenue Cutter Service was created by the U.S. Congress. Congress authorized the construction of ten cutters. These ships were built to enforce U.S. tariff laws.

President Woodrow Wilson signed into law the Coast Guard Act on 28 January 1915. This act combined the U.S. Revenue Cutter Service with the United States Life-Saving Service to form the new United States Coast Guard. The U.S. Coast Guard assumed the responsibilities of the United States Lighthouse Service in 1939 and the Navigation and Steamboat Inspection Service in 1942.
