

Erma Emiline Trent "Grandma", 94, of Parma went to see heaven on February 15, 2018. She was born March 27, 1923 on a ditch bank in Notus, to Jim and Emiline Pritchard. She was the third child of four; Harvey, Robert "Dugan", and Norma. Erma was raised in Roswell where she also attended school. During high school Erma and her sister Norma were both cheerleaders. This is when she met the love of her life, Fred Trent. After graduating from high school, Fred and Erma secretly eloped to Mountain Home, on May 7, 1942.

While Fred was in the Army, Erma attended Boise Business School. Her careers included the Experiment Station, Idaho Department Store, and Continental Telephone Company in Homedale, which she retired from after 20 plus years of managing the office.

Erma was a Beta Sigma Phi member and a Rebekah Lodge member. She held all offices in her local Parma Ruby Rebekah Lodge and then continued her membership in the Middleton Pansy Rebekah Lodge. She held office in 1978 as the President of the Idaho Rebekah Lodge. She truly enjoyed being a Rebekah and cherished the friendships made during her years of involvement.

Afew of Erma's favorite things were family gatherings, getting her hair done, shopping, her flowers, humming birds and eating out. Hamburgers, chocolate milkshakes and pie were the top of the food pyramid. Water was for cleaning and watering grass, not drinking. She loved telling stories of her childhood, the farm, square dancing, Bridge Club and her boys. Traveling was a highlight. From trips in the motor homes, the Grand Canyon, Disneyland, cruises, Hawaii and a lot more.

Erma is survived by her son Don Trent, wife Mary of Caldwell; daughter in law Linda Trent, of Parma; granddaughter Mechelle Brown, husband Eric of Nampa; grandson Nick Trent, wife Sammie of Boise; grandson James Trent, wife Katie of Glendale, AZ; grandson Drew Trent, wife Kaylee of Parma; great grandchildren Riley Brown and Jessica Brown (Mechelle) and Kendra Trent and Jordan Trent (James).

She was predeceased by her husband Fred Trent; son Bill Trent; parents Jim and Emiline Pritchard; brother Harvey Pritchard; brother Robert "Dugan" Pritchard; sister Norma Rose and many other family and friends.


District 4 Rebekah Meeting

Daylight Saving Time for the year 2018 starts on Sunday, March 11 and ends on Sunday, November 4.




Daylight saving time is the process of advancing our clocks one hour forward in Spring and back one hour in Autumn. As the

Priscilla Lodge No. 97 Begins in 1910 in New Plymouth

New Plymouth - In 1910 at a special meeting by request of the Odd Fellows, five women from New Plymouth wishing to form a Rebekah Lodge were initiated into Harmony #22 of Payette.

A request from the five sisters to have a Rebekah Lodge instituted in New Plymouth. On April 20, 1910 a dispensation was granted by Grand Master E.J. Phelps and Rebekah Assembly President Ella Horne and signed by Grand Secretary George H. Handy and Assembly Secretary Frances Crosson. Sister Frances Crosson instituted the Lodge with the assistance of sisters of Harmony #22 of Payette. Nineteen new members were voted into the Lodge. Five being the ones initiated into Payette.

Three names were voted upon for the Lodge name, being Priscilla, Apple Blossom and Orchard. Priscilla was chosen for Lodge No. 97.

Officers were elected with Anna Creasey being the first Noble Grand. The bylaws were made and the initiation fee was set at \$1.50 and dues \$.75. The bylaws were changed in 1913 making the initiation fee \$1.00.

The Lodge rented a piano, served dinners and had cooked food sales for money for their lodge. In 1921 the bylaws were changed again and fees were raised to \$5. In 1973 they were raised to \$10.

Estella LaCrone received the first Decoration of Chivalry from New Plymouth.

At the close of 1927, Priscilla had grown to 34 members. In 1929, four sisters received their 15-year Jewels. Since then we have kept our Jewels up to all eligible members.

In 1939 there was a new Odd Fellows Hall and a dispensation was requested to move the Charter from the old building to the new Hall. In March, a dedication banquet was held. A large crown of Odd Fellows and Rebekahs and their friends were present. The hall was named "Walter Burke Hall", in honor of an Odd Fellow and old time resident of New Plymouth. The Hall was built with money and efforts of Odd Fellows and Rebekahs, American Legion and their Ladies Auxiliary and many friends.

A six-month term was held until 1952 when it was voted to have a year term.

In 1954 a Theta Rho Club was instituted with 10 girls and 10 Rebekahs.

Priscilla has observed all anniversaries and donated to all worthy causes. Card parties and dinners are some of our money making projects.

We are a small Lodge, about 65 ladies and 9 men.
