
Dear Patriarchs:

Letter to the Editor

June 24, 2019

Dear Editor and Board Members of Idaho Odd Fellow/Rebekah News, I am writing in response to your article in the May, 2019 edition of the Idaho Odd Fellow/Rebekah News regarding the continuation of the newspaper.

I believe it is important to continue the newspaper so Rebekahs and Odd Fellows may stay connected to each other and know what our brothers and sisters throughout the state are doing. It is our bond to each other.

You offer several alternatives for printing the paper. I'd like to respond to each of them:

- **1. All digital**: Not everyone has access to a computer or cell phone, so they would have to rely on others for their paper.
- **2. Print quarterly**: A possibility. However, some future plans may not get into the paper. Such as, fund-raisers or community projects.
- **3. Bimonthly**: A good alternative. It would be easier to have a special section for upcoming events and still accommodate what has been achieved.
- **4. Raise subscription rates**: Many organizations are already strapped for money and having each member pay more could be a hardship for many.
- **5. Close out the newspaper altogether**: Doing so would disconnect the Rebekahs/ Oddfellows and we would lose the camaraderie of being a Rebekah/Oddfellow.
- **6. E-mail to each lodge**: This would put the cost of the paper, ink and postage for members no longer able to attend meetings on individual organizations which could be very expensive for large organizations.

Of the alternatives, I like the Bimonthly one best. Also, I don't think we need a July and August edition since we don't meet then. Everything for those months could be in the June and September issue. This would cut the publishing costs down to five issues or approximately \$1556.00 which is in the paper's budget.



2019 Odd Fellow Memorial Scholarship Presentation







Idaho Falls - On Monday, May 13th, PGM Dan Sanow had the pleasure of presenting the 2019 Odd Fellow Memorial Scholarship to Idaho Falls High School graduating senior, Faith Katseanes. Faith will be attending the University of Idaho in the fall and will be pursuing a degree in theatrical arts. The recipient of the second 2019 Odd Fellow Scholarship was a former graduate of Idaho Falls High School, Addyson Barnes who is currently enrolled in the University of Idaho. Addyson is majoring in Chemical Engineering with a minor in math.

The Odd Fellows Memorial Scholarship program was established in 2014 with the closing of the Idaho Falls Bingham Lodge. The program grants two \$5000 scholarships each year. One scholarship goes to a graduating senior of an Idaho Falls District 91 school and a second to a former graduate of an Idaho Falls District 91 school who has not previously received one. Should there be no applicants for the former graduate scholarship a second graduating senior is then selected. The selection process is aided by the District 91 Education Foundation Idaho School District 91 with the final decision being made from the "unidentified" qualified applicants by PGM Dan Sanow. The program was established with a \$100,000 donation from the sale of the Bingham Lodge building and will last as long as the invested donation funds last to support the scholarship program.



VJ Day

Date When Celebrated:

August 14th - Japan surrenders August 15th - Surrender announced to the world September 2 - Ceremony and formal signing of surrender



VJ Day marks the end of WWII, and the cessation of fighting against Japan. It is called "Victory In Japan Day or "Victory Over Japan Day".

The confusion over three dates:

There is some confusion over what date is V-J Day. You can consider any (or all) of three dates as V-J Day. President Harry S. Truman caused some of this confusion.......

On August 14, 1945, the Japanese government cabled to the U.S. their surrender. This is the date of most modern observances.

On August 15, 1945, news of the surrender was announced to the world. This sparked spontaneous celebrations over the final ending of World War II.

On September 2, 1945, a formal surrender ceremony was held in Tokyo Bay aboard the USS Missouri. At the time, President Truman declared September 2 to be VJ Day.

Regardless of which day you view as VJ Day, World War II was finally over.

A Little VJ Day History

The war in the Pacific was hard fought and bloody. The tide had definitely turned, and the U.S. military was fighting island by island towards Japan. Resistance was fierce. Casualties on both sides were high.

The U.S. had developed the atomic bomb. The U.S. government was anxious to end the war, and stop the loss of American lives.

On August 6th, 1945, the United States military dropped an atomic bomb over the city of Hiroshima, Japan in an effort to force Japan into an immediate, unconditional surrender. Instead of immediately surrendering, the Japanese government debated what to do. So, the U.S. dropped a second atomic bomb on August 9, 1945 over the city of Nagasaki, Japan. On August 14, 1945, Japanese Emperor Hirohito cabled the U.S. to surrender, and agreed to the terms of the Potsdam Declaration.

On August 15, 1945, news of the surrender was announced to the world. World War II was finally over. Hostilities ended.


On September 2, 1945, the Japanese formally surrendered aboard the U.S. battleship USS Missouri in Tokyo Bay. President Truman declared this to be V-J Day.

Did You Know? The battleship USS Missouri was chosen for the formal surrender ceremony, as she was named after President Truman's home state.
