
Ramblings From The Grand Secretary



Melba Petitioned for Charter in 1920

Melba - In 1920, six members of IOOF, holders of withdrawal cards of various lodges, petitioned the Grand Lodge of Idaho for institution.

Oct. 15, 1920 at 4 PM, Thomas Buckner, Grand Master of Idaho, called the petitioners together in a suitable room on the second floor of a frame building on the corner of Broadway and Second St. for the purpose of instituting Melba 105.

In 1925, the Odd Fellows purchased the former Gardiner Hotel from Carrie Rex for a lodge hall. Remodeling, taking out of partitions and other improvements makes it the present Melba IOOF hall.

The Melba Rebekah Lodge No. 105 was instituted on Dec. 11, 1920.

Melba Theta Rho No. 56, was instituted in 1973 by Assembly President Elimor Huff and Janet Markham, president of the Idaho workshop.

In 1925, the Rebekahs purchased a coal stove for the ante room, used, for the cost of \$3.00.

These days we are quite modern, with a furnace, electric lights and plumbing.

Flowers for the sick were geraniums which we could purchase for .50. The money was raised with 'penny drills' for the flower fund, netting from 110 to 150 per evening.

The IOOF hall, purchased in 1925, a former hotel, has been remodeled since the early years. The lodge room has lowered ceilings, paneled walls, new drapes, new desks and stations, filing cabinets, new memorial boards. New satin robes have been made for degree work.

Our dining hall has been completely remodeled and paneled.

Lawrence Edward Ford in Cambridge. Her oldest daughter was born 1954, Janice Ann. Her son, Lawrence Edward Jr. was born/died 1957. Youngest daughter was born 1959, Suzanne Marie. Lawrence and Mary Ann purchased and managed the Cambridge Market and also in the early years they worked on the Ford family ranch. Lawrence and Mary Ann always had the coffee on for friends and family to stop by and visit. When Mary Ann was 28, her husband had a tragic accident and their life changed. She spent years taking excellent care of him until his death in 1982. After his death Mary Ann saw a need for home health and hospice care in her community so with the help of several friends they started their own. She and Lawrence commercial fished for several years on the Oregon Coast and she also worked at the cannery. After her husband's death, she worked at the Idaho State Tax Commission, served on Cambridge City Council and worked at Lorton's Drug Store. She was a member of Cambridge Assembly of God and a member of the Rebekah Welcome Lodge #17 for over 75 years.

Mary Ann was proceeded in death by her husband Lawrence; infant son Lawrence Jr.; daughter Jan Bonner; parents Ellis and Bessie Peterson; sister Carol Dick; brother Larry Peterson; father and mother-in-law George and Ellen Ford;

Mary Ann's life was well-lived. She experienced many ups and downs and preserved always with the Lord at her side. She was known as GG, Murr, Auntie and held many titles that she took seriously. This amazing woman was an example of love, grace and strength. Her kindness, smile and sweet spirit will stay with us forever. She was a devoted wife & caretaker to Dad/Grandpa Ford; a great mother who raised two strong, independent daughters; who then went on to raise her strong granddaughters and great granddaughters. She had a love for adventure & travel, spending time at the Oregon & Washington coasts, Hawaii and Mexico with her family and went on a couple of cruises with her good friends, Pauline Dillon and Mary Wiley. The trip to Fort Benning GA and watched her great grandson graduate from Basic training/AIT was a very special trip to her. She had countless adventures in her RV. GG loved watching the boy's sports and cheered them on. She always attended the grandkids/ great grandkids events. She loved her home-away-from-home ("her happy hill") the Brownlee Summit Cabin and be surrounded by family and friends. You could drop by anytime, and she'd welcome you with open arms and an ear to listen or pray with you.

It is with great sadness she's no longer with us, but we are rejoicing that we will see her again. There is a huge void but we are thankful to know she is in heaven and that the dementia no longer has a hold on her.
