Update on the Pilgrimage for Youth (PFY) for 2023

"The PFY Board met on Nov. 5 and approved the following for this year's tour:

- The tour dates will be July 1-14. The end date was changed from July 13.
- Covid vaccinations are required.
- Proof of a Negative covid test 24 hours before the tour starts on July 1,
- Students will also test for covid on the last day in New York before they leave on the road trip.
- We will not be able to go to Canada this year. Last year we were not able to see anything in Ottawa because of construction on Parliament Hill. When the construction completed, we will resume our tour to Canada. We will still view Niagara Falls from the American side and take the Maid of the Mist to the Horseshoe Falls.
- Passports will not be required for our American students this year.
- We will be adding a day in Boston.
- We will be changing some things on the physical form. Remember, do not get a physical until after Jan. 15."

The above information is from the Sovereign Board Committee. Please let me know if your lodge hopes to send a delegate to the PFY this year as Sovereign is planning on making reservations for rooms and buses soon. You do not need to send me names at this time, just a number (sandiejocxx@aol.com).

Also, remember the first payment to Sovereign is due on or before January 1, 2023. The Delegate applications and second half of fee is due on or before April 1, 2023. Also, all applications are to be sent to the Jurisdictional Chairperson (Sandie Chandler, sandiejocxx@ aol.com), who will check each application to verify that everything has been completed and then will sign each application and forward all applications to the Executive Director.
