






In Loving Memory





Feb. 12, 1938 ~ June 19, 2024



BUHL - Tom Gordon Lancaster, 86, of Buhl, passed away June 19, 2024. He was born February 12, 1938, to Roy and Jane Lancaster of Filer. He was the 5th of 7 children, and his early life was spent with the family milking cows and pitching in on the Filer farm. He attended school at Poplar Hill and graduated from Filer High School in 1956. He joined the National Guard and served proudly as a young man.

In 1958, Tom married his high school sweetheart, Phyllis Lux. They were married 38 years and had three children, Brian, Margaret and Brad. In 1999, he married a second time to Marilyn Detrow, and they would have 24 wonderful years together, with her by his side when he passed.

Tom was a musician who could play by ear and was proficient at the piano, accordion, and guitar. In early married life, he and his cousin Robert and wife Phyllis would play for dances, and in later life he played with the Dance with Legacy Band for senior citizens.

Tom was a successful farmer most of his life. He was also an avid hunter, trap shooter, skier, builder, woodworker, farm mechanic, businessman, philanthropist, and politician.

Tom was an active member of the IOOF Lodge in Filer and was one of the founding members of the Filer Cemetery Association that took over control of the cemetery after the IOOF Lodge in Filer disbanded in the mid-90s. He was the Sexton of the Filer Cemetery for 30 plus years, starting in the late 80s and finally retiring in 2019 after successfully campaigning to have a cemetery district formed. He loved the cemetery and visited often after his retirement.

Tom Lancaster was an accomplished man who loved deeply and was well-loved in return. He will be missed by all who knew him.

Funeral services were held at Farmer Funeral Chapel, in Buhl. Burial was at the Filer Cemetery.

Proposed Bylaws of the Odd Fellow Funeral Aid Association of Idaho July 2024

Any member of a Subordinate Lodge within the Jurisdiction of Idaho, in good standing in their lodge, and in reasonable health at the date of their application, can become a member of Funeral Aid.

Funeral Aid Association was organized in 1921 and membership is voluntary.

The Association provides the following:

A sum for financial aid of \$500.00 (five hundred dollars) to defray the expenses of and incidental to the funeral of a deceased member of the Association, and/or for relief of their family, and will be paid to the members designated beneficiary.

Association committee Duties:

1. The Committee for the Funeral Aid will consist of three (3) Odd Fellows in good standing. These members have to be a participant of Funeral Aid. The members will be appointed by the Grand Master. The purpose of the Committee is to promote and administer the Funeral Aid program. The term of the Committee members will be for three year. One member of the committee will go off each year and a new appointment will be made.

2. The Grand Secretary and Subordinate Lodge Secretary will maintain a list of the members of Funeral Aid. The Subordinate Lodge Secretary will provide the Grand Secretary a list of their members belonging to Funeral Aid. The Subordinate Lodge Secretary will inform the Grand Secretary of any member who passes away. If the member is current on their assessments the Grand Secretary will request the Grand Treasurer to issue a check. The Grand Secretary will send the check to the Subordinate Lodge Secretary who will see that the beneficiary receives the check.

Assessment:

1. Upon the death of three (3) members, the members of the Funeral Aid Association, will pay an assessment of \$15 (fifteen dollars) within thirty (30) days from the date of such assessment.

2. Any member who fails to pay an assessment within thirty (30) days will be suspended from the program, and his/her beneficiary will not be entitled to receive any benefits and he/she shall forfeit all interest in the funds of the Association; the member and Subordinate Lodge shall be notified of such suspension and that reinstatement may be made by the member, in good standing, paying all assessments due following such suspension.

3. Membership in the Association is contingent upon good standing in a Subordinate Lodge of Odd Fellows in the State of Idaho. If a member withdraws, resigns, is dropped for non-payment of dues, or transfers from his/her Idaho Lodge to a Lodge in another Jurisdiction, his/her membership in the Association will be cancelled. The Association is not liable for refund of any assessments collected.

4. The benefit paid by the Association shall be paid to the member's named beneficiary. The member shall inform the Subordinate Lodge Secretary of his or her beneficiary. The payment will be made as soon after death of a member as practicable. Every attempt will be made to pay the beneficiary. If the information provided to the Subordinate Lodge Secretary isn't up-to-date, the Subordinate Lodge will be responsible to find the beneficiary. If there no beneficiary is found, then the funds will revert back to the Funeral Aid fund.

5. Upon the death of a member who is not delinquent for assessments, and who is less than one year in arrears for dues to his or her Subordinate Lodge, the funeral benefit provided by the Association shall be paid.

6. The Grand Treasurer of the Grand Lodge shall manage the funds for the Funeral Aid Association and, being notified by the Grand Secretary, will be responsible to issue to the Subordinate Lodge Secretary the payment for the beneficiary.

While the Funeral Aid Association is not operated by the Grand Lodge of Idaho, and is not under its control, the Grand Lodge took the following action at the time the Association was organized, and the Funeral Aid Association recognizes, accepts, and is bound by such action:


(a) That Association may be dissolved at any time by the Grand Lodge when in its judgment it shall be for the best interests of the Order so to do. Upon the dissolution of said Association either action by the Grand Lodge or voluntary action of its members, any money remaining in its funds after all its obligations are discharged shall be paid into and become a part of the endowment fund of the Grand Lodge.

(b) The Grand Lodge of Idaho shall never by liable for funding the payment of any of the benefits or other obligations of the Association.

Eligible members of the Subordinate Lodges of Idaho, who are interested in rendering voluntary help to the families of their departed brothers or sisters at a time when help is most needed, are invited to join the Odd Fellows' Funeral Aid Association. Remember, "To bury the dead" is one of our duties and a basic principles of Odd Fellowship.
